


2020 Financial Highlights

Letter from the Executive Director

There is no denying that COVID-19 shaped our year – but it did not define us. Rather, we were defined by duty, compassion, commitment, agility, resourcefulness, and perseverance.

- After a brief closure at the onset of the pandemic, we reopened our doors in response to Governor Walz's plea to care for the children of essential workers.
 It is not an exaggeration to say we considered this our civic duty.
- Because of their dedication, our teaching staff assumed the risks to their health
 of returning to work when so much was still unknown. They provided the
 children with a sense of normalcy and continued to nurture their growth and
 development.
- Our supporters provided families and staff with critical supplies, including food, gas cards, paper goods and cleaning products. They kept the food shelf stocked and arranged delivery and pick-up when we were closed.
- When schools moved to online learning, we opened a school-age classroom, primarily for our teachers' elementary-aged children. We boosted the wifi in the building to make sure everyone could connect and hired teachers to assist with remote learning.
- We were awarded a Paycheck Protection Program loan, which was later forgiven in its entirety. This, along with additional grants from the State and generous donations from our supporters, assured our financial sustainability.

As a result, we were able to serve 121 children in 2020; 51 received tuition assistance, including 34 Shirley Robinson Scholarships. Twenty-three children graduated in May 2021, ready for kindergarten! We never lost sight of the fact that being developmentally prepared for kindergarten is a strong predictor of future success in school and in life. In fact, when people ask me what we do at Bloom every day, even during a pandemic, I tell them that we build the future. We provide the foundation upon which all our children's future learning depends.
