At-Home COVID-19 Rapid Test

The state of Minnesota provided Bloom with BD Veritor at home COVID-19 tests. These are for the staff members and children above the age of 2 who are experiencing symptoms, or have a suspected close contact. This is a nasal swab test and a smart phone is required to complete. Bloom will not be administering any tests. If a child is excluded for illness, Bloom can send families with a kit to administer at home if they choose. Bloom's only responsibility is to log the results from the test. Families are not required to take the test kit. If your child is excluded for symptoms on the COVID-19 decision tree, a negative test result will be required before they return to Bloom. As a licensed center, Bloom is required to follow the COVID-19 decision tree. An updated version is available on our website. If you have any questions about your child's symptoms, potential exposures, and or to check on our routine illness exclusions; please do not hesitate to call, email, or stop in the office.

Celebrating our Differences
